Resolution No. 74-1

ADOPTION OF PRIORITY LIST ASSIGNING 1974-75 PROJECTS  
TO A PRIORITY CLASS AND SPECIFYING ELIGIBILITY OF  
PRIORITY CLASSES FOR FISCAL YEAR 1974-75

WHEREAS:

1. Title 23, California Administrative Code, Chapter 3, Subchapter 7, Article 4, requires that the State Board assign Fiscal Year 1974-75 Clean Water Grant projects to a priority list, and also provides that the resulting priority list be divided into two sections, the first section to be instructed to prepare project reports.
2. The State Water Resources Control Board has conducted a public hearing concerning the assignment of projects to the 1974-75 priority list.
3. The 1973 Survey of Needs for Municipal Wastewater Treatment Facilities identified needs for the State of California, far in excess of currently available funding. Funding of low priority projects is inconsistent with the Board's policy of solving the worst water quality problems first and does not recognize the large backlog of high priority needs.
4. Many projects would have met the minimum qualifications for Priority Class C or D if the issuance of waste discharge requirements had not been unavoidably delayed by Federal permit requirements. The Board's efforts to accelerate the grant process by processing one fiscal year's projects every six months has also caused many deserving projects to be classified in Priority Classes G and H because new waste discharge requirements could not be written and adopted in a timely manner.
5. Time constraints require that planning for large or complex projects be initiated as soon as possible.
6. Step 1 and Step 2 grants will allow facilities planning and design of large or complex projects to proceed in an efficient and orderly manner and are the most practical way large or complex projects can be completed within the time constraints now imposed by the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972 and Federal administrative procedures.
7. Planning for wet weather facilities for the City of Sacramento and the City and County of San Francisco should logically be accomplished concurrent with planning for the transport, treatment and disposal facilities.

8. The Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14 project for reclamation water distribution facilities has an immediate and identified reuse, will release an existing water supply for a higher order use, and will alleviate the need to develop new wells.
9. The Irvine Ranch Water District Project for 5 MGD additional secondary treatment provides many reclamation benefits, including an identified and immediate reuse, release of existing water supplies to a higher order use and elimination of the need to develop new water supplies.
10. An additional classroom module and pilot unit for the San Marcos Training Facility will benefit many dischargers in the State.
11. Several difficult and complex priority classification questions have developed which should be resolved by the Board at a Special Board Hearing.
12. The Santa Ynez Community Services District has acceptably documented a public health hazard and the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors has adopted a building moratorium. The moratorium, however, is not completely restrictive. Counsel for the District has stated that the County Board of Supervisors will amend the building moratorium within a week to meet grant project requirements.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. Except as hereafter specifically provided, each project designated on the priority list attached hereto, which said priority list is designated as "Exhibit A" and which is incorporated herein by reference, is assigned to the priority class specified in "Exhibit A".
2. The projects shown in "Exhibit B", attached hereto and incorporated herein, shall be assigned to the priority class set forth in "Exhibit B" for purposes of a Step 1 grant only. The provisions of Section 2124 of the grant regulations are waived with respect to any Step 1 grants made for these projects.
3. The projects shown in "Exhibit C", attached hereto and incorporated herein, shall be assigned to the priority class set forth in "Exhibit C" for purposes of a Step 2 grant only. Any grant contract for a Step 2 grant for any such project shall be executed only after submission and approval of an appropriate project report demonstrating that the project meets all applicable laws, regulations and guidelines. The provisions of Section 2124 are waived with respect to any Step 2 grants made for these projects.
4. The San Marcos Training Facility project for an added classroom module and pilot unit shall be assigned to Priority Class D.

5. The Los Angeles County Sanitation District No. 14 project for reclamation facilities and the Irvine Ranch Water District project for additional secondary treatment shall be assigned to Priority Class D.
6. Priority Classes A, B, C, and D as set forth in "Exhibit A" as revised pursuant to this resolution, are hereby designated as the first section of priority classes for Fiscal Year 1974-75, and will be instructed to prepare project reports as appropriate.
7. The State Board will consider the addition of projects to the 1974-75 project priority list in Priority Class C or D prior to June 1, 1974. To be considered for elevation to Class C or D, the Regional Water Quality Control Board having jurisdiction over the discharge must adopt current waste discharge requirements for the project involved, and the project must meet all requirements necessary for placement on the project priority list. Addition of large or complex projects to Priority Class C or D for the purpose of a Step 1 grant only, will also be considered prior to June 1, 1974.
8. Special Board Hearings shall be held to consider the priority classification of the following projects:
  - a. Los Angeles County Sanitation Districts (Long Beach and Los Coyotes Interceptors).
  - b. Big Bear Lake Sanitation District and Big Bear City Community Services District (Collection systems and interceptors for Moonridge, Sugarloaf, and Fawnskin ), Crestline Sanitation District (Burnt Mill Canyon Interceptor, Sawpit Canyon Interceptor, and Valley of the Moon Pump Station and/or Interceptor), Lake Arrowhead Sanitation District (Hooks Creek Interceptor and Deer Lodge Park Interceptor), and Casper South Service Corporation (Upgrade plant to secondary treatment ).
  - c. Chino Basin Municipal Water District (capacity in Ontario-Upland plant for Cucamonga, Montclair and Fontana).
9. Santa Ynez Collection System and Interceptor Project shall be placed in Priority Class B subject to receipt by the staff, within 30 days, of an acceptable building moratorium passed by the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors. The project shall automatically revert to Priority Class F if an acceptable building moratorium is not received.
