RESOLUTION NO. 75-107

AUGMENTING FUNDING UNDER AN AGREEMENT
WITH U. S. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE,
SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE, FOR AN
INTERGOVERNMENTAL PERSONNEL ASSIGNMENT

WHEREAS:

1. By Resolution No. 74-63 the State Board authorized the Executive Officer or his delegatee to execute an agreement with the U. S. Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service (SCS), for a two-year Intergovernmental Personnel Assignment for the services of an experienced SCS employee to work with the State Board staff in regulation and planning for water quality control in irrigated agriculture.
2. Resolution No. 74-63 limited the Executive Officer's funding commitment authority under the agreement to \$13,500 per year plus 51% of any required relocation expenses, which limitation accurately reflected the then-existing and reasonably foreseeable salary structure of the SCS employee contemplated as the subject of the Assignment.
3. The delegatee of the Executive Officer, pursuant to Resolution 74-63, executed on Intergovernmental Personnel Assignment document (U. S. Civil Service Commission Optional Form 69) which provided, as is the customary practice with respect to such Assignment documents, for Board reimbursement of SCS for 51% of the employee's salary and related benefits.
4. Said Assignment document further provided that any federal employee salary or benefit increases would become part of the agreement.
5. Unforeseen federal employee salary increases have caused the funding limitation in Resolution No. 74-63 to be inadequate fully to fund the Assignment agreement for the contemplated two years.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the funding limitation of \$13,500 per year specified in Resolution No. 74-63 is changed to \$14,240 for the first year and to \$14,855 for the second year; and be it further

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RESOLVED:

That the provisions of Resolution No. 74-63 are continued in effect in all other respects.
