RESOLUTION NO. 85-14

STATE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (PROPOSITION 2); ADDITION OF THE REGAN BEACH EROSION CONTROL PROJECT TO THE SUBPROJECT LIST OF THE LAKE TAHOE REMEDIAL EROSION AND URBAN RUNOFF CONTROL PROJECT

WHEREAS:

1. The Clean Water and Water Conservation Bond Law of 1978 (Proposition 2) contained provisions for the expenditure of up to \$50 million to fund water pollution control, water conservation and wastewater reclamation needs in the State;
2. The State Water Resources Control Board (State Board) designated the disbursement of Proposition 2 grant funds as the State Assistance Program (SAP);
3. The State Board has allocated \$10,000,000 to the Lahontan Regional Water Quality Control Board for the Lake Tahoe Remedial Erosion and Urban Runoff Control Project;
4. The \$10,000,000 will be divided among the number of subprojects;
5. The City of South Lake Tahoe has applied for grant funds from the State Assistance Program to construct the Regan Beach Erosion Control Project at an estimated cost of \$600,000;
6. The Regional Water Quality Control Board, Lahontan Region, approved this project for funding under the State Assistance Program at its November 9, 1984 meeting;
7. The erosion control improvements to be accomplished by this project is expected to result in a 50% to 75% reduction in nutrient and suspended sediment load carried to Lake Tahoe from the drainage area.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That the State Board approves the addition of the Regan Beach Erosion Control Project to the subproject list of the Lake Tahoe Remedial Erosion and Urban Runoff Control Project. The estimated project cost and sources of funding are as follows:

a. SAP grant	\$444,593
b. Local share (City's general fund)	<u>155,407</u>
Total	\$600,000
