## STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 95-57

AUTHORIZING ESTABLISHMENT OF A LINK DEPOSIT PROGRAM WITH STATE REVOLVING FUNDS TO ASSIST BIORECYCLING TECHNOLOGIES INCORPORATED WITH FUNDING OF A DAIRY WASTE MANURE RECYCLING FACILITY IN THE CHINO BASIN AREA SRF LOAN NO. C-06-6030-11

## WHEREAS:

- 1. Biorecycling Technologies Incorporated (BTI) has applied for a \$17.8 million State Revolving Fund (SRF) link deposit program to construct a Dairy Manure Recycling Facility (Project).
- 2. Dairy waste is the primary cause of ground water degradation in the Chino Basin, as outlined in the July 1990 Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) study titled "Dairies and Their Relationship to Water Quality in the Chino Basin".
- 3. The project will provide an effective means of addressing the dairy waste problem in the Chino Basin.
- 4. There is presently a \$15 million cap per project for Federal Fiscal Year 1995.

## THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The SWRCB approves establishment of a \$15 link deposit program to provide financial assistance to BTI to construct the Dairy Manure Recycling Facility contingent upon the County of Riverside's compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act.
- 2. In the event of termination or cessation of the project, the SWRCB will be entitled to withdraw its' funds from the bank administering the link deposit program with no further obligation upon the SWRCB to provide additional funds.

3. Staff will negotiate contract language addressing the issues pertaining to early withdrawal of funds in the event of project termination or cessation.
