STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD RESOLUTION NO. 2006 – 0016

AUTHORIZING FUNDING FROM THE STATE WATER POLLUTION CLEANUP AND ABATEMENT ACCOUNT (CAA) FOR ASSESSMENT OF BLUE-GREEN ALGAE (CYANOBACTERIA)

WHEREAS:

- 1. Toxins released from some blue-green algae blooms can pose risks to humans, pets, livestock, and wildlife;
- 2. Risks to people can occur when recreating in water or drinking water from a surface supply with algae blooms. Other beneficial uses may also be affected;
- 3. During recent years there has been increasing concern about environmental and health risks associated with this pollutant in California;
- 4. Additional information is needed to fully evaluate the occurrence and risk of blue-green algae toxins; and
- 5. It is appropriate to use funds from the CAA to remedy the effects of a significant unforeseen pollutant.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

The State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) approves funding of \$750,000 from the CAA for blue-green algae data collection and risk assessment.
