


SAVE OUR WATER INTRODUCTION

- Statewide public education and outreach program formed in drought year of 2009
- Administered by Association of California Water Agencies as a partnership between ACWA & California Department of Water Resources
- Researched-based; created to raise awareness of drought and help Californians conserve
- Focus later shifted to help water agencies meet mandate to reduce per-capita water consumption 20% by 2020








2014 DROUGHT: In January, the Governor declared a <u>Drought State of Emergency for California</u>, and in April called on citizens to <u>redouble their efforts</u> to conserve water. With a goal of reducing personal water usage by 20 percent, check out the <u>Save Our Water</u> campaign for some great tips on <u>What We Can Do</u>, and be sure to take advantage of the local programs detailed below. For the months of March and April, water usage in Napa was down almost 25 percent compared to last year. We urge customers to continue this excellent progress by sweeping instead of hosing off pavement, using a local carwash that recycles, and limiting lawn watering to early morning one or two days per week. Use our <u>Drought Survival</u> Guides to navigate this irrigation season: <u>Lawns</u>, <u>Trees & Shrubs</u>, <u>Mulch</u>. Read our <u>May 6th Drought update</u> in the *Napa Valley Register for additional information*.

Water use efficiency (a.k.a. water conservation) is an integral part of the City of Napa's long-term water management strategy. As a signatory to the *Memorandum of Understandina Beagandina Urban Water Conservation in California*, the City is committed to implementing the appropriate Best Management Practices (BMPs) to ensure future supply reliability. To comply with the <u>Water Conservation Act of 2009 (SSA-7.7</u>), the City is working to reduce demand below 132 gallons per capita per day (gpcd) by 2020. For our customers this means we are available to help you make every drop count, and every form you save will refure you row water billing.



From 1997 to 2002, demand on our water system averaged 170 gpcd. Since 2003 when the City began to implement more California BMPs, demand has averaged less than 150 gpcd, including a low of 139 gpcd in 2011. This trend results from the evolution of water-efficient appliances, City ordinances and programs, and water recycling. We look to continue this progress by offering our customers a variety of financial incentives and educational proportunities:
