Staff Revisions on  
Tentative Waste Discharge Requirements and  
Response to Comments  
Chester Public Utility District  
Chester Wastewater Treatment Plant  
Plumas County

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At a public hearing scheduled for 18/19 February 2016, the Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region (Central Valley Water Board) will consider adoption of tentative Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) No. CA0077747) and a tentative Cease and Desist Order (CDO) for the Chester Public Utility District's (Discharger) Chester Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Below is a summary of revisions made to the tentative NPDES permit and revisions made to a Central Valley Water Board staff response on comments provided by the Central Valley Clean Water Association:

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**Central Valley Water Board Modifications to the Tentative WDR**

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Central Valley Water Board staff has made the following modifications to the tentative WDR:

1. Section VI.C.2.b (pages 14-15) was deleted: *Groundwater Monitoring Network Verification and Groundwater Quality Characterization Study*.
2. Section VI.C.2.c (page 15) was deleted: *Best Practical Treatment or Control (BPTC)*.
3. Attachment E, Section X.D.1 (page E-21), report requirements, referencing item numbers 1 and 2, above, were deleted from Table E-17.
4. Attachment F, Section VI.2.b (page F-49), was deleted: *Groundwater Monitoring Network Verification and Groundwater Quality Characterization Study*.
5. Attachment F, Section VI.2.c (page F-49), was deleted: *Best Practical Treatment or Control (BPTC)*.

### **Central Valley Water Board Modifications to the Response to Comments**

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Central Valley Water Board staff has made the following modifications to the response to comments:

1. The comment response from Central Valley Water Board staff was replaced with the below language regarding the Central Valley Clean Water Association's second comment on the *Groundwater Characterization Study*.

“The following requirements have been removed from the tentative NPDES permit, including any references therein: *Groundwater Monitoring Network Verification and Groundwater Quality Characterization Study* and *Best Practical Treatment or Control (BPTC)* report.”
