NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**CONSIDERATION OF RENEWAL OF WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS
(NPDES PERMIT NO. CA0079081)**

FOR

CITY OF CHICO

CHICO WATER POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT

BUTTE COUNTY

The City of Chico (Discharger) owns and operates a water pollution control plant (Facility) in the City of Chico, Butte County. The facility provides secondary level treatment of municipal wastewater. Treatment consists of preliminary influent screening, grit removal, primary clarification, activated sludge biological treatment, secondary clarification, chlorination, and dechlorination. Final disposal of treated wastewater is to the Sacramento River. The discharge is regulated under existing Waste Discharge Requirements (WDRs) Order R5-2010-0019 and National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit No. CA0079081. The Discharger submitted a Report of Waste Discharge and requested renewal of the existing WDRs and NPDES permit. Staff recommends the Central Valley Water Board adopt the tentative WDRs and NPDES permit to regulate discharge from the Facility.

A public hearing to address this matter will be held during the Central Valley Water Board meeting, which is scheduled for:

The designated parties for this hearing are as follows:

- Staff of Central Valley Water Board
- City of Chico

Designated parties but not interested persons will have these rights: to call and examine witnesses; to cross-examine opposing witnesses; to impeach any witness; and to rebut the evidence against him or her. Central Valley Water Board staff will prepare the administrative record, and may present evidence, make an oral presentation and cross-examine opposing witnesses.

Interested persons may not cross examine witnesses, and will not be subject to cross examination. Interested persons may submit evidence (e.g., photographs, eye-witness testimony, monitoring data) if the evidence is submitted in accordance with the deadlines for submitting evidence described below. Interested persons who present evidence may be subject to cross-examination. Interested persons may request status as a designated party for purposes of this hearing by submitting such request in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 pm on 4 March 2016**. The request must explain the basis for status as a designated party and in particular how the person is affected by the discharge.

The tentative Order was issued on **4 February 2016**. Persons wishing to comment on this item must submit testimony, evidence, if any, and/or comments in writing to the Central Valley Water Board no later than **5:00 pm on 4 March 2016**. Written materials submitted after this date and time will not be accepted and will not be incorporated into the administrative record if doing so would prejudice any party.

All designated parties and interested persons may speak at the Central Valley Water Board meeting, and are expected to orally summarize their written submittals. Oral testimony and cross examination will be limited in time by the Board Chair. Both designated parties and interested persons may be asked to respond to clarifying questions from Board members, counsel staff or others, at the discretion of the Board.


