NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT AND PUBLIC HEARING FOR

PROPOSED TERMINATION OF ORDER No. R2-2018-0033 CEASE AND DESIST ORDER FOR CITY OF VALLEJO, VALLEJO FLOOD WASTEWATER DISTRICT, FOR VIOLATION OF TRASH REQUIREMENTS OF MUNICIPAL REGIONAL STORMWATER NPDES PERMIT, ORDER No. R2-2015-0049

NOTICE IS HERBY GIVEN THAT the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (Water Board) will accept written comments on the Tentative Order to terminate Order No. R2-2018-0033, Cease and Desist Order for City of Vallejo, Vallejo Flood Wastewater District (City).

The Tentative Order would terminate the Cease and Desist Order, issued to the City for violation of trash control requirements of the Municipal Regional Stormwater NPDES Permit (Order No. R2-2015-0049). The City has met the Cease and Desist Order's requirements by reducing trash loads by 80 percent.
