RE-NOTICE OF APPLICATION 32372 AND PETITION FOR CHANGE PURSUANT TO WATER CODE SECTION 1707 FOR STATEMENT OF DIVERSION AND USE 24280

COUNTY: Sonoma

STREAM SYSTEM: Russian River

Application 32372 is being re-noticed for an additional 10 days to conform with Water Code Section 1303.

On March 30, 2015, Westminster Woods Camp and Conference Center (Applicant/Petitioner) filed an application to appropriate water by permit and a petition for change to dedicate water for instream beneficial uses pursuant to Water Code Section 1707 under Statement of Diversion and Use S024280. The application was submitted as part of a fisheries enhancement project to improve instream flow in Dutch Bill Creek. The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration’s Restoration Center (NOAA) are in support of this project.
