NOTICE OF WASTEWATER CHANGE PETITION WW0108

COUNTY: Sonoma STREAM SYSTEM: Petaluma River

The City of Petaluma (City) has filed a wastewater change petition with the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Water Rights (Division) pursuant to Water Code section 1211. Currently, the City discharges 1,550 million gallons (MG) of treated wastewater over the period of October 21 to April 30 to the Petaluma River from the Ellis Creek Water Recycling Facility. The City requests authorization to reduce discharges by up to 181 MG per year. The City proposes to eliminate discharge during the period of October 21 to October 31; the current average discharge during this period is 2.5 million gallons per day (MGD). The City also proposes to reduce discharge by an average of 0.86 MGD of stored treated wastewater from November 1 through April 30. The City is prohibited from discharge to the Petaluma River from May 1 to October 20 per its National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit and either recycles or stores treated wastewater during this period. Currently, water not recycled during the May 1 to October 20 discharge prohibition period is either recycled or discharged to the Petaluma River starting October 21. The proposed change would delay commencement of this discharge until November 1 of each year.

<u>Present</u>: An average discharge of 8.12 MGD to the Petaluma River from October 21 to April 30 of each year, and a 2.5 MGD average discharge to the Petaluma River during October 21 to 31 of each year.

<u>Proposed</u>: Zero discharge to the Petaluma River from October 21 to 31 and a reduction of up to 156 MG to the Petaluma River from November through April.
