# **ORDER**

Treated Waste Water Change Petition WW-11

# ORDER APPROVING CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND PURPOSE OF USE OF TREATED WASTE WATER

#### WHEREAS:

- 1. Treated Waste Water change petition WW-11 was filed by the County Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles on June 25, 1991 pursuant to Sections 1210 and 1211 of the California Water Code.
- 2. The change petition was filed with the State Water Resources Control Board (Board) to obtain Board approval under Sections 1211 and 1700 of the California Water Code to change the Place of Use and Purpose of Use of treated waste water discharge to the Santa Clara River.
- 3. Information is not available to adequately determine the impact of the project on fish and wildlife resources, therefore, this order should reserve jurisdiction regarding same.
- 4. The Board has determined that good cause for the changes has been shown.
- 5. The Board has determined that the changes do not constitute the initiation of a new right nor operate to the injury of any other lawful user of water.

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

- 1. The source of treated waste water shall be from the Valencia Water.

  Reclamation Plant within the SE% of NE% of projected Section 18, T4N,

  R16W, SBB&M. California Coordinate System: Zone 7, North 4,268;900 and

  East 4,108,950.

- 2. The Place of Use shall be the Windmill Tree Farms (North [48 acres], Hilltop [11 acres], and South [11 acres], Magic Mountain Amusement Park [245 acres, the future Westridge Golf Course [798.5 acres]), and the CalTrans Median: within projected Sections 8, 17, 18, 19, 20, 29, 30, and 32, T4N, R16W, SBB&M: as shown on map on file with the Board. (0000004)
- 3. The Purpose of Use shall be irrigation.

4. The Board reserves jurisdiction in the public interest to modify the terms and conditions of this order, including imposition of requirements to alter project facilities or operations and to modify instream flow releases, in the event of unforeseen adverse impact to fish or wildlife. Board action will be taken only after notice to interested parties and opportunity for hearing. (000000M)
