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ORDER INCREASING THE RATE OF USE OF TREATED WASTEWATER

WHEREAS:

- 1. Treated Wastewater change petition WW-21 was filed by the City of Lodi, owner/operator of the White Slough Water Pollution Control Facility (WSWPCF) in San Joaquin County of January 12, 1993 pursuant to Section 1210 and 1211 of the California Water Code.
- 2. The petition was filed with the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to change, under Sections 1211 and 1700 of the California Water Code, the place of use and purpose of use of treated wastewater discharged from the WSWPCF in San Joaquin County.
- 3. On May 18, 1994 a second petition was filed to increase the diversion rate.
- 4. The SWRCB has determined that good cause for the change has been shown.
- 5. The SWRCB has determined that the change does not constitute the initiation of a new right nor operate to the injury of any other lawful user of water.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Condition 4 be added to WW-21 to read as follows:

The amount of treated wastewater shall not exceed 2.17 cubic feet per second.
