### Re: California WaterFix Hearing on Petition for Change: Request to Establish Separate Hearing Part for Presentation of Terms and Conditions and Supporting Evidence

Dear Hearing Chair Doduc, Hearing Officer Marcus, and California WaterFix Hearing Staff:

The Sacramento Valley Group,<sup>i</sup> Tehama-Colusa Canal Authority and water service contractors in its service area,<sup>ii</sup> North Delta Water Agency and certain reclamation districts,<sup>iii</sup> and the Delta Flood Control Group<sup>iv</sup> ("Downey Brand Protestants") submit this request regarding the presentation of proposed terms and conditions in connection with the California WaterFix Petition for Change and Hearing.

The Downey Brand Protestants acknowledge that the Hearing Officers have encouraged the parties to include proposed permit conditions as part of their cases in chief or rebuttal cases. However, based on how the hearing process has unfolded to date the Downey Brand Protestants believe that a more efficient and effective approach to the submission of terms and conditions would be to schedule a separate phase of the hearing, to occur at the conclusion of Part 2, for the submission of terms and conditions for approval of the Petition and limited supporting evidence. This "Part 3" of the proceeding would be the exclusive venue for submission and consideration of proposed permit conditions and evidence supporting those proposed conditions. We believe that the hearing process has provided additional information about the project proposed by the Petitioners as well as the potential for injury as presented by the cases in chief of numerous protestants. It has been noted by the Sacramento Valley Water Users and other parties that the issues of Part 1 and Part 2 have intersected at times during this proceeding and will continue to

do so through presentation of evidence during Part 2.<sup>1</sup> For example, the alternative modeling assumptions presented by the Sacramento Valley Water Users reveal important effects of the proposed project that must be incorporated into the State Water Resources Control Board's consideration of any terms and conditions for approval of the subject Petition.

Accordingly, we request that the submittal of proposed permit conditions and any necessary supporting evidence occur exclusively after the conclusion of Part 2. In order for proposed permit conditions to address all aspects of potential injury and other key hearing issues, those proposed conditions are best developed and presented after all evidence has been submitted in the course of the hearing process. We suggest that the State Water Resources Control Board require proposed permit conditions be submitted 60 days after the completion of Part 2.

In addition to presenting proposed permit conditions after the conclusion of Part 2, parties should be permitted to present limited supporting evidence as needed to show how the proposed conditions would alleviate injury to a water user. The introduction of this evidence would be similar to the introduction of rebuttal evidence in that cross examination would be limited to the scope of the supporting evidence.

Nothing in this letter shall be construed as an admission, express or implied, that Petitioners have met their burden of proof in this proceeding or that the Petition should be approved. The Downey Brand Protestants reserve all rights to contest any approval of the Petition by the State Water Resources Control Board.

The Downey Brand Protestants appreciate your consideration of these requests.
