To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing as a concerned citizen, regarding the California WaterFix, and request that my comments be entered into the record.

I did not find the issue of changing weather patterns discussed in the documents. It appears that the project is based on the idea that relatively recent historical weather patterns, in which northern California is blessed with sufficient snow pack in the winter resulting in summer water supplies, and southern California is not, will continue to hold in the future. It is highly unlikely that future weather patterns will resemble those of the past: indeed, if the jet stream is forced further south by increasingly large ridges and troughs in the upper level weather patterns, as we are beginning to see, it is more likely that the resulting wet weather will also dip southward. In other words, the entire project is based on historical rain and snow patterns which, even now, are changing.
