Subject: Water Flows crucial to life!

Hello-

I am writing because I am very concerned that relaxing Bay inflows in March could spell extinction for many Bay fish species. Continuing business as usual would be an unconscionable act and cause another ecological tragedy—not to mention the economic impact of losing key fish species.

I urge you and the State Water Resources Control Board to:

1. Reverse the decision to relax the D-1641 March requirements for inflows to San Francisco Bay and ensure that these flows critical to the continued existence of Delta smelt, winter-run Chinook salmon and other species are actually provided.
2. Reverse the decision to partly relax the D-1641 limits on export pumping, in order to prevent devastating impacts on the last remaining Delta smelt and winter-run salmon.
