We are in a terrible drought and we are doing our part individually and collectively to reach out to Californians about conservation. We are terribly concerned that despite our best efforts, there are still many industries and residents wasting water. This waste should not lead to the utter demise of our riparian habitat and species. We encourage you to:

1. Reverse the State Water Board's decision to relax the D-1641 March requirements for inflows to San Francisco Bay and ensure that these flows critical to the continued existence of Delta smelt, winter-run Chinook salmon and other species are actually provided.
2. Reverse the State Water Board's decision to partly relax the D-1641 limits on export pumping, in order to prevent devastating impacts on the last remaining Delta smelt and winter-run salmon
