Dear Ms. Farwell:

The Department of Fish and Game (Department) objects to the inclusion of the Final Environmental Impact Report (FEIR) into the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) administrative record for the Cachuma Project. Many statements and conclusions contained in the FEIR related to public trust resources in the Santa Ynez River are misleading, false, and in many cases, outdated. The Department is concerned that these statements and conclusions will be given the same evidentiary weight as evidence presented during the hearing proceedings without receiving the same level of scrutiny and examination.

It does not appear to be an unusual practice for the SWRCB to make its FEIR consultants available for cross-examination in the context of a water right proceeding. In fact, the Department was recently a party to a water right proceeding concerning the water right application of the El Sur Ranch, and the SWRCB's EIR consultants were presented as witnesses and made available for cross-examination during that hearing. Given the amount of time that has passed between the conclusion of the Cachuma Project water right hearing and the availability of the FEIR, the Department requests that the SWRCB allow the parties opportunity to cross-examine the factual statements and conclusions contained in the FEIR before it is formally accepted into the administrative record.
