PERMIT 20784 (APPLICATION 29977) OF FAHEY, COTTONWOOD SPRING AND DEADWOOD SPRING IN TUOLUMNE COUNTY

Thank you for your June 20, 1995 letter offering a more detailed description of your proposed replacement water source(s). It was not clear from earlier correspondence that releases from Phoenix Lake would be imported water from the Stanislaus River. To the extent that imported water is released from Phoenix Lake into the Tuolumne River System specifically as replacement for water consumed in your proposed water bottling operation, we are satisfied that this part of your proposed agreement with Tuolumne Utility District (TUD) meets the intent of Condition 20 of Permit 20784.

We have, however, remaining concerns about your proposal to use runoff from snowmaking operations at Dodge Ridge Ski Area as replacement water. Assuming that water has been used for snowmaking purposes, the melt runoff has returned to, and has been a component of, the Tuolumne River System. We believe the intent of the permit condition requiring replacement water is to provide additional water not currently present in the Tuolumne River System. In this context, we feel that the melt runoff would not qualify as replacement water added to the current Tuolumne River System flows to offset your proposed use.
