Good Morning Marty,

I hope you had a good weekend.

Below are some final issues that I need to resolve. The TROA notice is ready to give to Cam for review (with the exception of the mailing list that I will discuss below), as soon as we resolve the issues of my 6/14/2006 email entitled Notes on the TROA Notice 6/13/2006, and the following:

1) In the Prosser Creek Reservoir (License 18006 –Application No 10180) petition, the attachment to the petition requests that the provision that follows be removed (Page 2 of the attachment):

“The Licensee shall operate Prosser Creek Reservoir in coordination with releases of water from Lake Tahoe in the Truckee River in accordance with the operation schedule contained in the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, Prosser Creek Reservoir Operation Study, January 14, 1958, and amended July 1, 1958, on file with the Board, or in accordance with any modified operation schedule that may be submitted by the Licensee, and approved by the State Water Resources Control Board after notice and opportunity to be heard has been given to all parties and other interested persons in this proceeding.”

The Petitioners request that the above term be replaced by the operating criteria provided in TROA. The term change must to be included in the notice, so I'll need the wording the TROA group wants to use as a replacement.

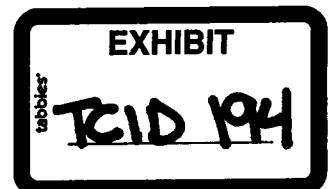
2) Also, in the attachment of the Independence Reservoir petition (License 4196 – Application No. 9247). The Petitioners request that Stampede and Boca be added as Points of Diversion to License 4196. As I discussed in my email of 6/14/2006, No. 2 regarding Stampede Reservoir, it is not possible to add Points of Diversion that are below the point of control of the original water right. As discussed earlier, any Point of Diversion that is below the original point of control constitutes a new water right. The points of rediversion and redistribution of storage can be included for Independence Reservoir.

3) With regards to the mailing list: I spoke to Dave Wathen and Joli Porter (of the federal watermasters in Reno) on Friday, June 16, 2006 about the Truckee River diverters. Dave was able to get a list of the APNs from the Nevada State Engineer and he is going to see if the Washoe County assessor's office can match the current owners of the APNs. He says he has 20,000 records from the State Engineer's office. There may be fewer records than that, once the assessor's office matches the APN numbers due to changes in APN numbers. I have asked them to see if they can put the names and addresses in an excel spreadsheet, so that I can convert them to an access database for labels. They will need to send the list on a CD, because our email system will block an attachment that large. I told Dave that I would give him a call today after I either spoke to you or Kenneth, before anymore work was done on the list. Would either you or Kenneth call me, so I can decide the best way to proceed?

4) The map is still outstanding, but as we have discussed, you will get a revised copy to me for approval that delineates the existing/proposed points of rediversion. We will move the notice forward for review; however, we will need the map, as soon as possible, for the review process.
